LIEUTENANT-GENERAL T. KELLY-KENNY, C.B., AND STAFF.

Commanding the Sixth Division.

General Kelly-Kenny is, perhaps, one of the best known and most popular officers of the British Army. All his regimental service was spent with the "2nd Queens," and, more recently, he has earned an excellent reputation as a Staff Officer and an Aldershot Brigadier. There is no sounder and more level-headed soldier in Her Majesty's Army than the General Officer Commanding the Sixth Division in South Africa, who did such excellent work in harassing Cronje's retreat before the surrender at Paardeberg.
